23) Courses in which students' assessment of teachers is introduced & the actions are taken on students' feedback:

❖ There are 21 courses in B.A. faculty, 22 courses in B.Sc. Home Science & 21 courses in B.F.D. faculty, in which assessment of lecturers was introduced.

❖ A student feedback mechanism was introduced by preparing a questionnaire to get feedbacks from students about their college experience as well as the lecturers' teaching quality and methods.

❖ Upon receiving feedbacks through these questionnaires, a statistical analysis report is prepared that assesses lecturers' performance on the scale of 1-5, which is then forwarded to the principal.

- ❖ The principal, then, carefully reviews the report and invites his faculty & staff members over for a meeting. Any matters of concern, especially those needing immediate actions, are addressed and a plan to improve the over-all quality of student experience is laid out as a parameter for the future.


Details of Our Institution's Plans for Next Year:

- 1) We are encouraging our non-teaching staff members to take advantage of the gym located in the college campus building.
- 2) Seeing the ever increasing importance of computerization in teaching and documentation, we are also providing those members of our non-teaching staff, which do not have ample computer education, with appropriate computer use training to help increase their productivity.
- 3) Tweaking the trend a bit, we are now making on-campus computing stations available to all college students for their academic and general use. To encourage use of computers among them, we are now extending our computer education programs to 1st and 2nd year students as well.
- 4) To improve research culture we are encouraging our teaching faculty members who are yet to finish their PhD's to take up research projects and finish them as soon as they can. For the faculty members who have finished their PhD's already, we highly recommend them to take up research and/or minor or major projects.
- 5) To improve our students' confidence level and self-belief, we are implementing a small weekly project under which a student is randomly chosen to deliver a 15 minute lesson every week. A student is chosen randomly every Monday and given 3 days to

prepare for her lecture, eventually to be delivered on Fridays. The chosen student can either choose to deliver a lecture on a topic that has already been taught or simply choose a new topic from the on-going lecture (the student can ask the lecturer for help in choosing her lecture topic). This not only compels the student to indulge in self-study and research, but also gives them a chance to speak in front of their classmates and build their confidence and self-belief.


6) We have recently applied for a one-day National seminar for the subjects English, Marathi and Family Resource Management.
